In <u>Sutton</u> County on bids received June 29th 1933, contract for completion of Grading and Drainage Structures from 10 miles west of Sonora and extending to Sonora, in Sutton County, a distance of 10.045 miles, on State Highway No. 27 F.A.P. No. 617-C, Unit No. I is awarded to Womack-Henning Const. Co., Abilene, Texas, for \$18,844.23, which is the lowest and best bid.

7774

In <u>Callahan</u> and <u>Taylor</u> Counties it is ordered by the Commission that State Highway #36 be extended from Cross Plains to Abilene, on condition that counties furnish not less than 100' right-of-way on location to be approved by the State Highway Engineer.

7775

In <u>Colorado</u>, <u>Fayette</u> and <u>Caldwell</u> Counties the State Highway Engineer is directed to proceed with surveys for reconstructing such short sections of State Highway #3 in said counties in order to eliminate grade crossings the counties affected having agreed to secure the necessary right-of-way on such short sections.

In <u>Comanche</u> and <u>Eastland</u> Counties the State Highway Engineer is directed to make location of State Highway #36 from Comanche to Rising Star, on condition that the counties affected will agree that they will secure not less than 100° right-of-way on location to be approved by the State Highway Engineer.

In <u>Hill</u> and <u>Limestone</u> Counties it is ordered by the Commission that location be made on State Highway #171 from Hillsboro to Cooledge, on condition that counties furnish not less than 100' right-of-way on location to be approved by the State Highway Engineer.

7783

In <u>Bastrop</u> County it is ordered by the Commission that grading and drainage structures on the Old San Antonio Road from Bastrop to Paige be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1; the grade separation on Highway No. 71 below Smithville as Project No. 2, and the construction of Highway No. 95 as Project No. 3.

7784

In <u>Bell</u> County it is ordered by the Commission that the construction of Highway No. 2 from Temple north be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1 and Highway No. 36 as project No. 2 in said county

7785

In <u>Blanco</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that an asphalt topping on Highway No. 66 from Johnson City to the Burnet County be recommended to the Burneu of Public Roads as Project No. 1 to cost approximately \$30,000.00.

7786

In <u>Brewster</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that Highway #3 be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1 and Highway No. 99 through county as Project No. 2.

7787

In <u>Brown</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that the improvement of a road from Brownwood to the Callahan County line be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1, on condition that county will make the necessary agreement as to maintenance.

7788

In <u>Burnet</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that Highway No.66 from Burnet south be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1 and such work as can be done on Highway No. 66 north as Project No. 2.

7789

In <u>Callahan</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that approximately fifteen miles of grading and structures of Highway No. 191 from Baird south to the Coleman County line be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1.

7790

In <u>Cameron</u> County it is ordered by the Commission that the County receive its pro rata part of Federal Aid funds for the relief of unemployment, and that the County Commissioners Court and the Division Engineer of the State Highway Department jointly recommend to the State Highway Commission, in the order of their importance, projects to be constructed in Cameron County, to cost approximately \$220,000.00

In <u>Cameron</u> County it is ordered by the Commission that \$71,000 in bonds escrowed in State National Bank of Brownsville, Texas, be released to the County, on condition that the Attorney General will approve such release, and with the further understanding that all of that part of the \$71,000.00 which was escrowed in the Merchants National Bank of Brownsville which is not collectable will not be a charge against the State Highway Department and the Board of County and District Bond Indebtadness.

In <u>Carson</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that the construction of the lateral road from the Hutchinson County line across the northwest corner of Carson County to connection with the concrete pavement at the Gray County line; approximately 13 miles, be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1.

7793

In <u>Castro</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that Highway No. 194 in Castro County be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1.

7794

In <u>Coleman</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that four miles of Highway No. 16 from Rockwood to the Colorado River, including a bridge of the river, be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1; and nine miles of grading and drainage structures on Highway No. 191 from Coleman north be recommended as Project No. 2.

7795

In <u>Collingsworth</u> County it is ordered by the Commission that bridge over Salt Fork of Red River and Grading and drainage structures on Highway No. 4 from Red River north be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as projects to be constructed out of the National Recovery Highway Fund; and that contract be let, as soon as funds are available, for Unit II on Highway #4 from the River to the Childress County line.

In <u>Comal</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that the completion of Highway No. 2 through the county be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1 and Highway No. 46 through county as Project No. 2.

7797

In <u>Comanche</u> County it is ordered by the Commission that the topping of Highway No. 10 through the county be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1 and the grading and drainage structures on Highway No. 36 as Project No. 2.

7798

In <u>Crosby</u> County the Highway Commission will recommend to the Bureau of Public Roads that funds to be allotted to said county under the National Recovery Act should be used towards the completion of State Highway #24 in said county.

7799

In <u>Dallam</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that the completion of Highway No. 5 from Dalhart to Texline be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1 and the construction of Highway No. 56 from Dalhart to Sherman County line as Project No. 2.

7800

In <u>Dallas</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that Unit II on Highway No. 1 from Rosemont Street to Tarrant County line be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1, including an underpass on the Texas & Pacific Railroad between Dallas and the Tarrant County line to cost approximately \$60,000.00; and Highway No. 1 between Dallas and Garland as Project No. 2.

7801

In <u>Deaf Smith</u> County it is ordered by the Commission that the improvement of Highway No. 33 from the Randall County line to the Castro County line be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1.

7802

In <u>Delta</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that improvement and widening of State Highway #24 in said county be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as #1 preference project for said county; and that Unit II on State Highway #154 from Cooper east be recommended as Project No. 2.

7803

It is ordered by the Commission that in the City of Eastland, in Eastland County, that the application to improve Highway No. 67 and change the location of the highway be postponed until estimates can be secured on the cost of the improvement question.

7804

In <u>Eastland</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that the building of Highway No. 187, the reconditioning of Highway No. 67 from Carbon to the Comanche County line and the reconstruction of Highway No. 23 from four miles west of Rising Star to Rising Star and from Cisco south, a distance of approximately eight or nine miles, be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1; with the understanding that the average cost will not exceed \$90,000.00, and with the further understanding that Eastland County will furnish such right-of-way as may be required.

7805

In <u>Ellis</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that the improvement of Highway No. 68 be recommended to the Bureau of Public Hoads as Project No. 1 and Highway No. 34 as Project No. 2.

7806

In <u>Erath</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that Highway No. 10 through the county be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1 and Highway No. 66 through the county as roject No. 2.

7807

In <u>Greeg</u> County it is ordered by the Commission that Highway No. 26 from Longview to Kilgore be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1; Highway No. 15 from Longview to Gladewater as Project No. 2; Highway No. 176 from Kilgore to Tyler as Project No. 3, and Highway No. 135 from Gladewater to Kilgore as Project No. 4.

7808

In <u>Harrison</u> County it is ordered by the Commission that gravel base on approximately ten miles of Highway No. 155 from Marshall northwest be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1; and the extension of Highway No. 43 from Marshall to Caddo Lake be recommended as Project No. 2.

7809

In <u>Have</u> County it is ordered by the Commission that Highway No. 80 from Wimberly to an intersection with Highway No. 66 at Blanco be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1 and the improvement of Highway No. 2 as Project No. 2.

7810

In Henderson County, it is ordered by the Commission that a road be constructed from LaRue to New York, approximately 4 miles, on condition that Henderson County will construct Unit I on standard specifications of the Highway Department; when Unit I has been constructed by the County the Department will gravel and asphalt the road, with the understanding that after it is constructed Henderson County will assume the merpetual maintenance, and with the further understanding that the State Highway Department will not be required to build the road from New York to Baxter.

7811

In <u>Hood</u> County it is ordered by the Commission that Highway No. 144 be extended from Glenrose, via Granbury and Lipan to a point on Highway No. 89 near Brandons Bridge and that the improvement of said road be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1 in Hood County

7812

In <u>Hutchinson</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that the completion of approximately six miles of Highway No. 117 from Stinnett north be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1, and the construction of a section of the lateral road from near the town of Borger to the Carson County line as Project No. 2.

7813

In <u>Irion</u> County it is ordered by the Commission that Highway No. 99 from Reagan County line east, a distance of 10 miles be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1; and the continuation of the road on to Mertzon as Project No. 2.

7814

In <u>Jeff Davis</u> County it is ordered by the Commission that Highway No. 3 through County be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as roject No. 1 and finishing of bridge over Limpia Canyon on Highway No. 17 as Project No. 2 and Highway No. 118 through county as Project No. 3.

7815

In <u>Kimble</u> County it is ordered by the Commission that the construction of a bridge over North Llano River, in Kimble County on Highway No. 27, and the grading and drainage structures on Highway No. 4 from junction to the Menard County line as Project No. 2.

7816

In Lampasas County, it is ordered by the Commission that the grading and drainage structures on Highway No. 66 and the overpass north of Lampasas be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1 and any improvement that can be done on Highways 53 and 74 as Project No. 2.

7817

In Lee County, it is ordered by the Commission that Highway No. 44 be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1, particularly from Giddings north to a point that will require an expenditure of approximately \$75,000.00; and Project No. 2 will be the second section north.

7818

In <u>Lipscomb</u> County it is ordered by the Commission that the overpass and underpass on Highway No. 117 be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1.

7819

In <u>Mason</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that the construction of a bridge over Comanche Creek on Highway No. 9 be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1 and the completion of the section from Mason south to the pavement, approximately 4 miles, as Project No. 2.

7820

It is ordered by the Commission that the completion of all the projects on Highway No. 2, in McLennan County aggregating \$220,000.00 be recommended for approval of the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1 in said county, and that the first unit of Highway No. 7 west of Waco be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads for Project No. 2 in McLennan County.

7821

In <u>Milam</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that the construction of an underpass at Rockdale at a cost of approximately \$54,000.00 be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1 and Highway No. ## north of Cameron as Project No. 2.

7822

In <u>Moore</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that the completion of Highway No. 9 from the Potter County line to Dumas be recommended to the Bureau of Public Hoads as Project No. 1; and Highway No. 178 from Dumas to the Hartley County line as Project No. 2.

7823

In Nacogdoches County application for extension of State Highway
No. 103 from Lufkin to Chireno was referred to the State Highway Engineer
for investigation and report.

7824

In <u>Oldham</u> County it is ordered by the Commission that Highway No. 13, from the Potter County line to the town of Vega be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1; and from Vega to Adrian as Project No. 2.

7825

In <u>Parker</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that the construction of Highway No. 1 through Weatherford, in Parker County, be recommended to the Bureau of Public Hoads as Project No.1; and Highway No. 122 from Weatherford to Cresson as Project No. 2.

7826

In <u>Pecos</u> County, it is ordered by the Highway Commission that the completion of Highway No. 27 from Fort Stockton east be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1 and Highway No. 99 from Fort Stockton east as Project No. 2.

7827

In <u>Presidio</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that the completion of Highway No. 3 through the county be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1, and Highway No. 17 through the county as Project No. 2.

7828

In <u>Runnels</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that State Highway No. 4 from Winters south to concrete pavement, be recommended for approval by the <u>Bureau</u> of Public County on condition that County will furnish not less than 100° right-of-way on location to be approved by the State Highway Engineer.

7829

In <u>Runnels</u> and <u>Coke</u> Counties it is ordered by the Commission that location be made of State Highway #109 from Bronte to Ballinger with the understanding that the counties will furnish not less than 100° right-of-way on approved location.

7830

In Sherman County, it is ordered by the Commission that Highway No. 56 from the Dallam County line to the Oklahoma State line be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1 and the completion of Highway No. 9 from Stratford south to the Moore County line as Project No. 2.

7831

In <u>Somervell</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that topping 12 miles of Highway No. 68 from the Erath County line toward Glenrose be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1.

7832

In <u>Stephens</u> County it is ordered by the Commission that recommendation be made to the Bureau of Public Roads to improve a highway from Caddo south to the Eastland County line as a lateral or feeder road, on condition that Stephens County will enter into an agreement with the Bureau of Public Roads to maintain such road after it has been improved, this being the only project Stephens County is requesting.

In Stonewall and Dickens Counties it is ordered by the Commission that location be made of State Highway No. 18 from Asperment to Spur, on condition that counties affected will agree in advance to furnish not less than 100° right-of-way on location to be approved by the State Highway Engineer.

7834

In <u>Travis</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that drainage structures on Highway No. 2 south of Austin be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1; Walnut Creek Bridge north of Austin as Project No. 2, and the improvement of Onion Creek Bridge as Project No. 3.

7835

In <u>Upshur</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that grading and drainage Structures on Highway No. 155 from Gilmer to the Harrison County line be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1, provided that the projects be limited to cost, not more than \$100,000; and that an underpass at Gilmer be recommended as Project No. 2, to cost approximately \$20,000.00.

7836

In <u>Upton</u> County, it is ordered by the Commission that grading and drainage structures on Highway No. 137 be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1; with the understanding that the Highway Department, through the maintenance forces, will construct a caliche base following the grading and drainage structures.

7837

In <u>Van Zandt</u> County it is ordered by the Commission that grading and drainage structures on Highway No. 19 from Henderson County line to Canton be recommended to the Bureau of Public Roads as Project No. 1 and grading and drainage structures on Highway No. 19 from Canton to Grand Saline as Project No. 2.

7838
